Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of CHATAK AGRO (I) PRIVATE LIMITED, which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2024, the Statement of Profit and Loss for the year ended on that date, notes to the financial statement and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Accounting Standards) Rules, 2014 and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2024, the profit / loss for the year

Basis for Opinion


